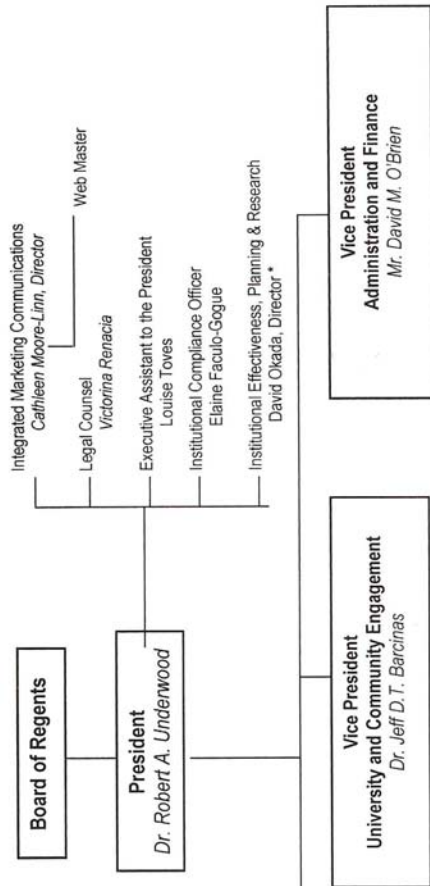

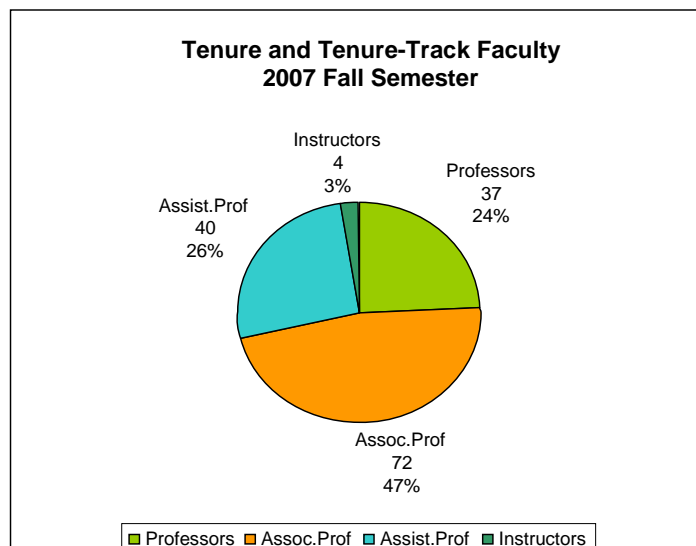

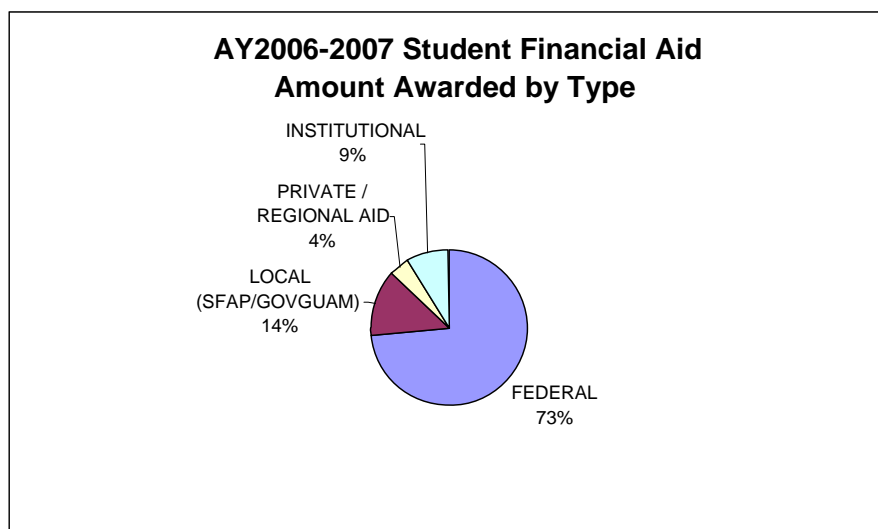

## Tuition and Semester Fees (AY2007-2008)

- Resident Rate
  - Undergraduate: \$157 per credit hour; example: \$1884 for 12 credits (full-time status)
  - Graduate: \$213 per credit hour; example: \$1917 for 9 credits (full-time status)
- Non-resident and International Rate
  - Undergraduate: \$467 per credit hour, example: \$5604 for 12 credits (full-time status)
  - Graduate: \$528 per credit hour; example: \$4752 for 9 credits (full-time status)
- A 10% increase in the tuition rates is scheduled for AY2008-2009
- Semester Fees
  - Undergraduate: \$112.50 for five (5) credits or less, \$225 for six (6) or more credits
  - Graduate: \$225 flat fee

## Financial Aid Awards (Academic Year 2006-2007)

- 58% of students received financial aid; of those students, 87% received Federal aid
- Total aid was \$15,451,97.73; of this amount, 73% for was for Federal awards, 14% was for Local program awards, 4% was for Private/Regional awards, and 9% was for Institutional awards

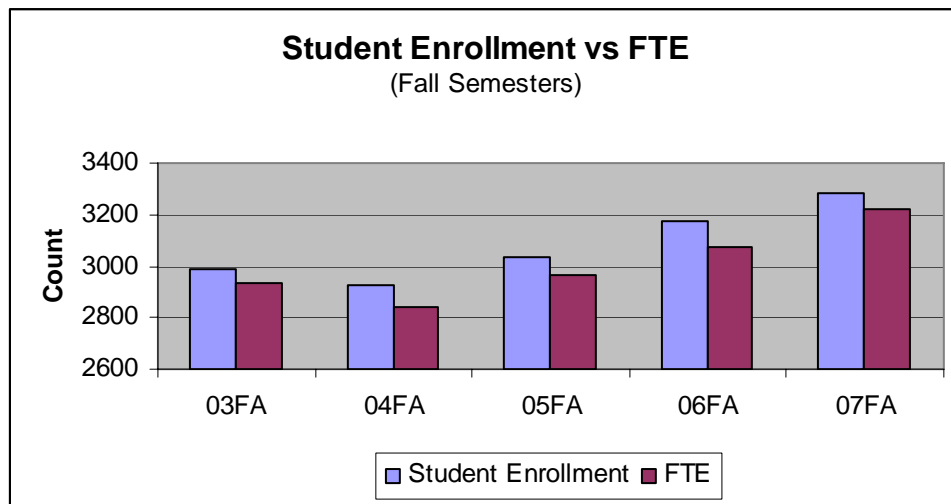

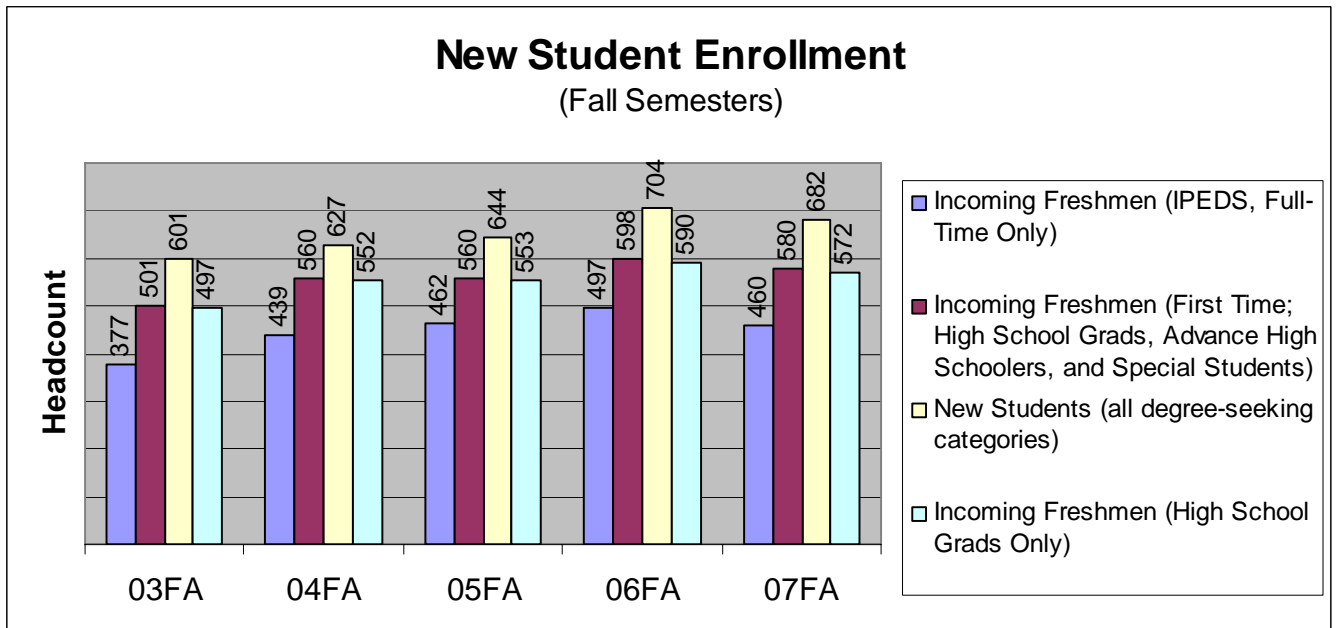

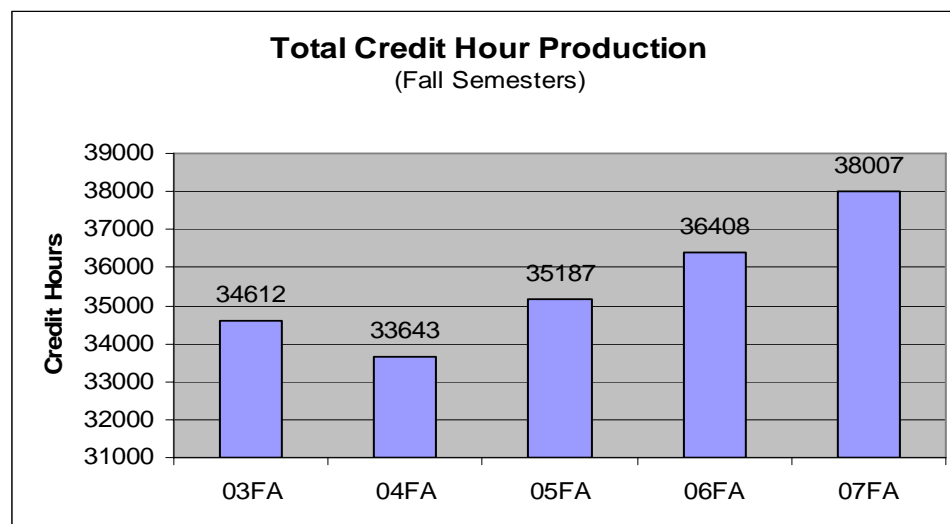

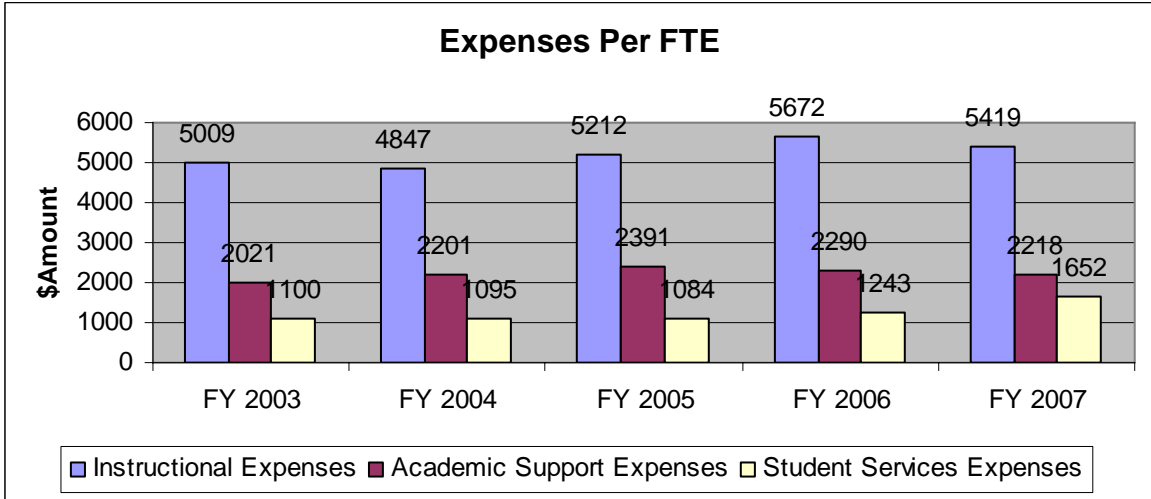

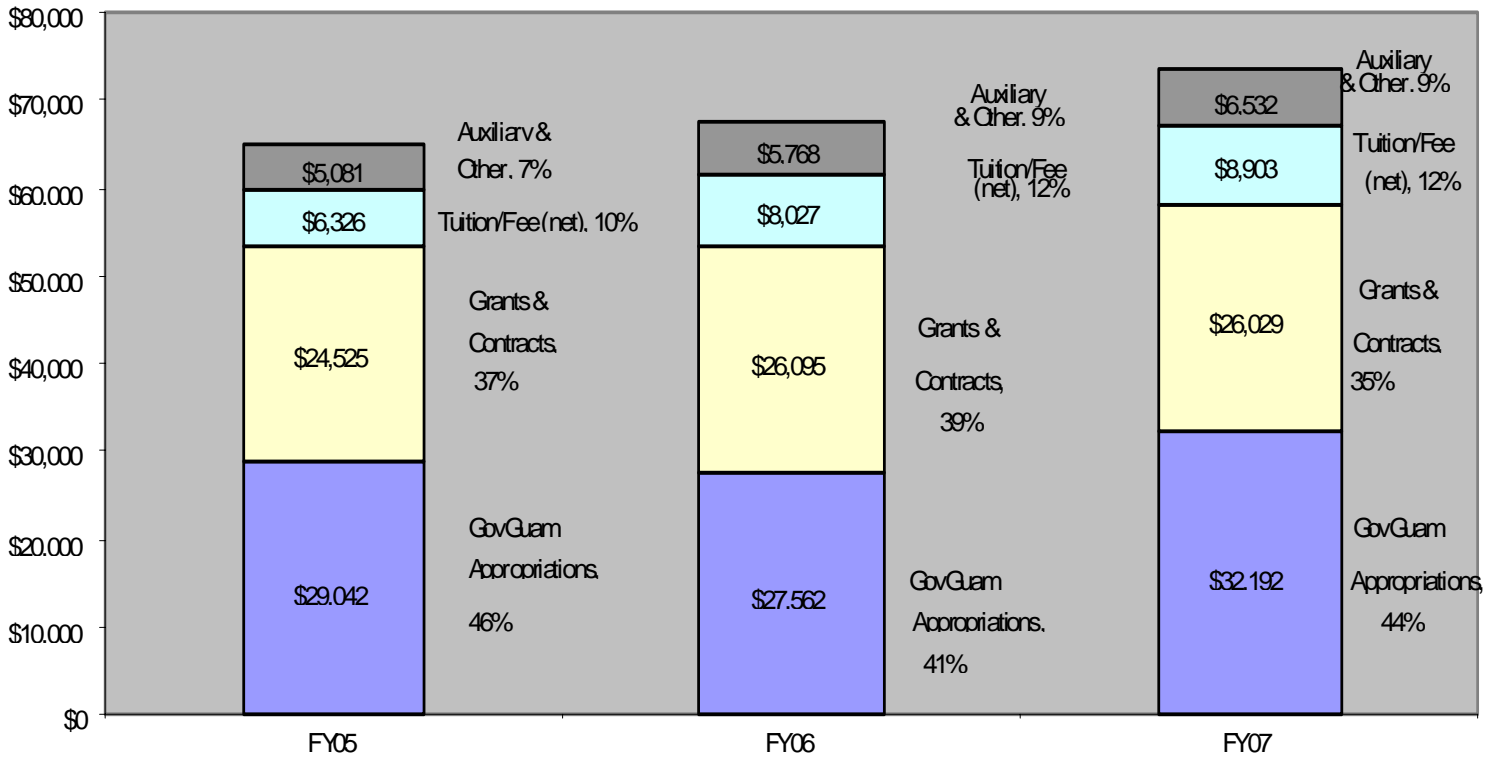

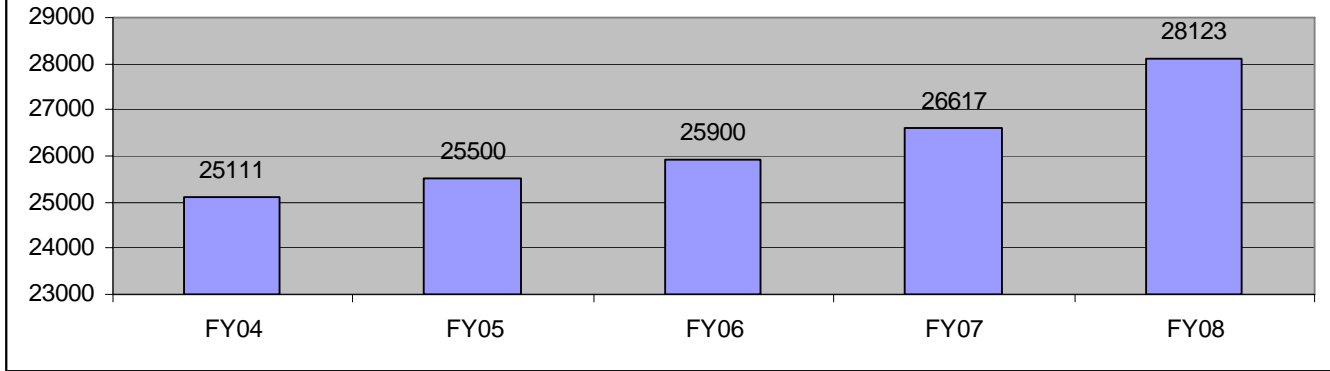

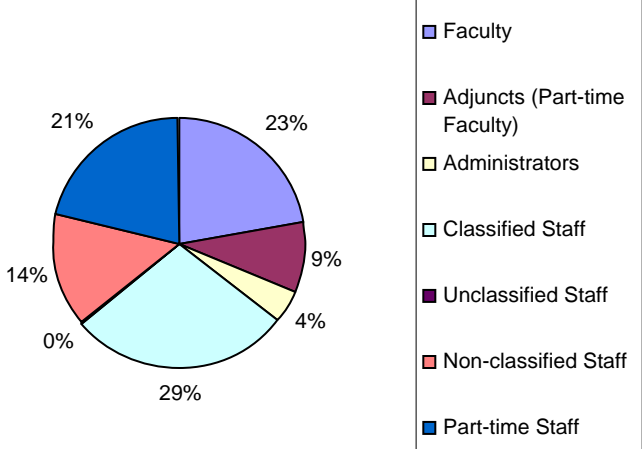
### General Operations Appropriation From Government of Guam (in \$000s)

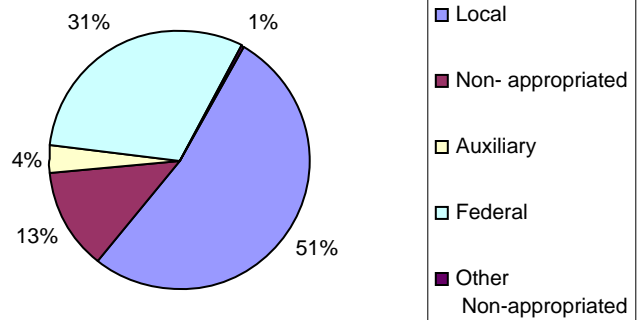
### Employee Categories and Funding Sources
