Welcome to another informative edition of the University of Guam Fact Book! This publication is designed to be a convenient reference guide of data defining who we are as a university and how we've grown and progressed in our 69-year history.

The 2020–2021 academic year was one of transition and challenges as we continued to adjust to the new normal. While the pandemic took a toll on college enrollment nationwide from 2019 to 2020, ours fell only 3% as the majority of students here in Guam readily embraced online learning and remained focused on their education. Even more encouraging was our 9% increase in first-time freshmen



enrollees at a time when public universities nationwide were seeing a decrease of 8%.

Our degree conferrals did not wane either. In fact, we celebrated the largest graduating class in UOG history with 383 degrees awarded in Fañomnåkan 2021. We also celebrated the first 21 graduates of our criminal justice partnership program with the Northern Marianas College.

With every passing year, we add to the more than 19,000 UOG alumni who are engaged, dynamic professionals in Guam, our neighboring island communities, and across the world. We are proud to continue to be the only U.S.-accredited university in the Western Pacific.

I hope this Fact Book will be a valuable resource as we continue advancing education in the island communities across this great region of Micronesia.

Institutional Profile

The University of Guam is an open-admissions, U.S. land-grant public comprehensive university offering on a semester basis 15 master's degree programs, 25 bachelor's degree programs, and several certificate programs in both onsite and online course offerings. These programs are administered by the College of Liberal Arts and Social Sciences ("CLASS"), the College of Natural and Applied Sciences ("CNAS"), the School of Business and Public Administration ("SBPA"), the School of Engineering ("SENG"), the School of Education ("SOE"), and the School of Health ("SOH"). In addition, continuing education unit (CEU) classes, professional development training, and English language training are offered through the Global Learning and Engagement (GLE) Office. The Enrollment Management & Student Success ("EMSS") Division supports student success and student life with services from Admissions & Records, Financial Aid Office, Residence Hall, Student Counseling, Student Health, Student Life Office, and TRiO Programs. Fanuchånan (Fall) 2020 student enrollment was 3,449. The University of Guam has conferred over 19,600 degrees over the past 69 years.

Guam offers exciting research opportunities found nowhere else in the world. Research at UOG is supported by the Office of Research and Sponsored Programs (ORSP). The ORSP supports faculty members and eligible University personnel to conduct research activities in collaboration with the various Micronesia colleges, as well as select public and private agencies locally, nationally, and internationally.

Research impacts all areas — from student success and cutting-edge academic programs to locally sustainable lifestyles. Last year, UOG completed a strategic planning process and published the Para Hulo' Strategic Plan of 2019-2024. Strategic Initiative #1, "Being recognized as a RESEARCH UNIVERSITY centered in island wisdom", sets the stage for research to become an even more prominent activity at the University. As stated within Strategic Initiative #1, the goal is for the University of Guam to become a nationally and internationally recognized research university as a Doctoral Professional University (DP/U) under the Carnegie Foundation for the Advancement of Teaching. Currently, the UOG is classified as "Master's Colleges and Universities I". This new Carnegie (DP/U)

classification will earn the University of Guam a respected voice in the global conversation on topics intimately familiar to and of concern to this region and its cultures, such as marine science, climate change, and indigenous languages and cultures. We are pleased to report that significant progress has been made in the realization of the above-mentioned goals, and despite the daunting challenges caused by the pandemic, this has been an outstanding year for research and scholarly achievements here at the University of Guam. In FY2020, UOG received a new five-year \$20M National Science Foundation funded Established Program to Stimulate Competitive Research (EPSCoR) grant, and a 3rd five-year cycle of funding of \$7.3M for the National Cancer Institute funded Pacific Island Partnership for Cancer Health Equity (U54-PIPCHE) grant. These and many other projects were accomplished by the hardworking faculty and staff of UOG who continue to remain competitive in securing

extramural funding. In FY2020, we collaborated with multiple off-island scientists and institutions, provided employment to the local community, and offered students the opportunity to gain valuable research experience. (FY20 OSRP Annual Report)







Faculty Status Employee Profile

For the 2020 Fanuchanan Semester, 312 employees were categorized under faculty status. Of the 312, there were:

- ❖ 52% men and 48% women
- 34% Pacific Islander, 32% Asian, 23% White, Non-Hispanic, 2% Hispanic, 2% Nonresident alien, 1% Black or African American, and 6% Other or two or more races or ethnicities
- ❖ 180 (58%) were full-time, of these:
 - 57% men, 43% women
 - 33% White, Non-Hispanic, 31% Asian, 27% Pacific Islander,
 4% Nonresident alien, 1% Black or African American, 2%
 Hispanic, and 3% Other or two or more races or ethnicities
 - 51% tenured, 30% on tenure track, and 19% not on tenure track
- ❖ 132 (42%) were part-time, of these:
 - 45% men, 55% women
 - 45% Pacific Islander, 33% Asian, 9% White, Non-Hispanic,
 3% Hispanic, 0% Black or African American, and 10% Other or two or more races or ethnicities


Financial Aid Awards (AY 2020-2021)

from private scholarships, 7% from regional awards, 4% from institutional awards, and 14% from COVID Relief Funds.






Alumni Relations

FY 2020 Financial Trends

GASB 75 continues to have a significant impact on the University's financial statements. The University's change in net position decreased from a gain of \$.07 million to a loss of \$2.8 million. Other factors contributing to the losses are as follows:

- The University sought to grow its general operations appropriation to the level of prior years. However, the appropriation for FY20 was \$394,000 less than FY19.
- The University entered into promissory notes with the UOG Endowment Foundation in the amount of \$1.4 million to pay for the construction of a new water line.


For FY20, The University was allocated \$4.5 million of the CARES Act HEERF. Fifty percent of the amount is to be awarded directly to students to provide emergency financial aid grants for expenses related to the disruptions of campus operations due to the coronavirus (COVID-19) and the other half is for institutional use. The University has been achieving the goals set forth in the terms of the grant.

The University has been awarded an additional five-year \$20 million grant from National Science Foundation EPSCoR to expand its research capabilities on coral reef survival in rapidly changing environmental conditions.

COMPARATIVE EXPENSES (IN \$1,000)

The University spent \$47.7 million, or 46%, of its total expenses of \$103.6 million directly on its Core Mission. Of that, 46% went to instruction, 32% to public service, and 22% to research. Changes in total expenses fluctuated largely as a result of the implementation of Governmental Accounting Standards Board Statement No.75 (GASB 75), Accounting and Financial Reporting for Postemployment Benefits Other Than Pensions, and awarding of CARES Act HEERF to students.



COMPARATIVE REVENUES (IN \$1,000)

In FY2020, university-generated revenues were \$63.7 million, or 63%, of the University's total revenue of \$100.8 million, with a Government of Guam (GovGuam) allotment of \$36.5 million, or 36%, and other revenues of \$562,000, or 1%. The overall increase in revenue are due to 1) a minimal increase in fees for all students and a minimal increase in tuition rate for resident students and 2) increase in revenue from grants and contracts, mainly pertaining to the U.S. National Science Foundation Experimental Program to Stimulate Competitive Research (EPSCoR) grant and the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund (HEERF).





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
Percentage of Total Students Enrolled & Total Credit Hour Production by College/School






