AWARDS MAY BE MADE TO:

1. Prominent alumni.
2. Successful business leaders.
3. Distinguished professional persons.
4. Statesmen and civic leaders.
5. Prominent educators.
6. Distinguished persons in the arts, sciences, and humanities.
7. Commencement speakers who may belong to one of the above categories.

AWARDS SHOULD NOT BE MADE TO:

1. Present members of the Board of Regents.
2. Members of the faculty or administration.
3. Persons who are unable to accept the award personally.
4. Large donors whose only contribution to UOG and other causes are financial.

In considering a person for nomination, you may wish to ask these questions:

1. Does the candidate show a high order of achievement, including significant or lasting contribution to a profession, discipline, or community?
2. Does the person possess outstanding intellectual or creative gifts?
3. Is this a person of high reputation, character, and dedication?
4. Has this person made a difference in the betterment of our island, region, or nation?

NOMINATION QUESTIONS

1. How do you rate the nominee's professional and/or other achievements in terms of quality and significance?
2. How do you rate the nominee's achievements in terms of duration? Is the impact life-long or more short-term?
3. Has the nominee overcome serious obstacles or handicaps in attaining a record of achievement?
4. Have the nominee's efforts improved the quality of life here on Guam?
5. Have the nominee's efforts improved the quality of life in Micronesia?
6. Have the nominee's accomplishments improved the quality of life nationally or internationally?
7. Are the nominee's achievements recognized on Guam?
8. Are the nominee's achievements recognized in Micronesia?
9. Are the nominee's achievements recognized nationally or internationally?
10. Is the nominee a person of solid reputation and character?
