- Once all required documents have been submitted, the UOG Financial Aid Office will process your application.

STEP 3

Application Review & Awarding Process

- The review process may take two to six weeks from the start of the semester and depending on when all documents are submitted.
- Check WebAdvisor for award amounts and your E-Triton e-mail weekly for important announcements from the Financial Aid Office.
- Award funds are always applied to tuition and fees. Remaining credit balances are issued in the form of a refund check.

Dear UOG Students,

The University of Guam is committed to your success by providing a quality education in a safe environment. Sexual harassment and misconduct of any kind on-campus, off-campus and anywhere is unacceptable. The safety and well-being of all members of our University Community is not only our priority, but a responsibility we share with our students.

As a University of Guam student and a member of the University Community, you have the right to learn and study in an environment free from sexual misconduct and discrimination. You also have the right to file a complaint and have it heard in a responsible and clear manner.

To ensure your rights are upheld, we have taken the following steps to strengthen our processes and policies:

Sexual Harassment Training

Beginning October 2015, UOG has required all employees to complete annual online sexual harassment training. Beginning Fall 2016, all students will also be required to take the online training before registering for classes.

Sexual Misconduct Policy Update

In Fall 2015, President Underwood created a five-member Task Force which included UOG representation from faculty, staff and students to recommend revisions to our sexual harassment and consensual sex policies. A special Board of Regents meeting will be held in March to adopt the new policy. You can view the policy on the UOG website.

UOG Helpline

We have established a dedicated **Helpline at 735-HELP (4357)** which anyone can call directly to report any sexual misconduct. All reports will be considered privileged information and will be investigated.

A Helpline website has also been launched at **www.uog.edu/helpline** with easy to understand information and resources about your options, rights and instructions on what to do if you or someone you know has experienced sexual harassment or discrimination.

Facility Upgrades

We are implementing a plan to ensure adequate lighting around the campus for evening classes. We are also exploring updates and expansions for alarms, CCTV cameras, early warning systems and more security presence around campus.

These efforts are part of our enduring and firm commitment to our students and the University Community. We will take extra steps to make our campus even safer and more secure. SCHEDULE ADJUSTMENT

YOU MAY MAKE A SCHEDULE ADJUSTMENT DURING EARLY, OPEN, AND DURING THE SCHEDULE ADJUSTMENT PERIOD. A schedule adjustment may be made at any Satellite

Location or at the Admissions and Records Office, or WebAdvisor.

AUDITING CLASSES

Student may apply to audit classes without credit. Please refer to the catalog for application procedures, deadlines, and fees.

IT IS THE RESPONSIBILITY OF THE STUDENT TO REVIEW HIS/HER CLASS SCHEDULE. COURSES REGISTERED BUT NOT ATTENDED AND NOT DROPPED WILL RECEIVE THE GRADE OF "UW" AND THE STUDENT WILL BE FINANCIALLY OBLIGATED FOR THE PAYMENT OF COURSE(S) AND OTHER FEES.

PAYMENT OF COURSES. Students must adhere to Payment Deadlines. All payments are made at the Cashier's Office located in the Administration Building. If payment is to be made by mail, it must reach the University by the Payment Deadline.

TUITION AND FEE PAYMENT

Resident and Non-Resident Students

An applicant is initially classified as a resident or non-resident for tuition purposes at the time of application with the Office of Admissions. The classification, which is certified by the Registrar, is based upon information furnished by the student and from other relevant sources. In compliance with the Residency Policy passed by the Board of Regents on February 1996 and amended on May 1997 and June 17,2004, students in Non-Resident status are required to pay non-resident tuition.

The considerations used in determining Residency status are as follows:

- 1. Establishment of a domicile on Guam or in one of the Freely Associated States (the Commonwealth of the Northern Marianas Islands, the Federated States of Micronesia, the Marshal Islands, or the Republic of Palau) as mandated by 17GC16125. (a) for a period of twelve month prior to the beginning of the term for which residency is claimed, or
- 2. Evidence of residency for a period of twelve months or more prior to the beginning of the term for which residency is claimed. Evidence of residency will be shown by a student providing documentation from one of the following:

- · Permanent employment on Guam (verification of employment)
- · Payment of income taxes of Guam (by student, or by parent/guardian if the student is a dependent).
- Ownership or rental of living quarters on Guam.
- Continue to use a Guam permanent address on ALL RECORDS (educational, employment, military, financial).
- Retain your Guam voter's registration.
- · Maintain a Guam driver's license or vehicle registration. If it is necessary to change your license or registration while temporarily residing in another location, the license MUST be changed back to Guam within 10 days of the date of return to Guam, and the vehicle registration must be changed within 20 days of the date of return.
- · Village Mayor's certification of residency.
- 3. Students who have filed for an Adjustment to Permanent Resident Status will be eligible for resident rate only if they have resided on Guam for twelve consecutive months prior to applying to the university and have submitted the following supporting documents:
 - A Notice of Action for the Adjustment to Permanent Resident Status from the USCIS.
 - Proof of residency (documents to prove living on Guam for the last twelve months prior to applying to the university).
 - A Notice of Action denying the student's application for an Adjustment to Permanent Resident Status will render the student ineligible for resident tuition rate.
 - The burden of proof is upon the student making a claim to resident student's status. The admission of students who knowingly provide false information for the purpose of achieving resident status shall be subject to cancellation and adjusted billing.

EXEMPTIONS TO THE TWELVE-MONTH REQUIREMENT WHERE RESIDENT **CLASSIFICATION MAY APPLY:**

GRADUATE OF A GUAM HIGH SCHOOL

You may be entitled to an exemption from nonresident tuition if you attended high school in Guam for three (3) or more years AND graduated from a Guam high school. You are not eligible for this exemption if you are a nonimmigrant alien.

ATTENDED ELEMENTARY AND MIDDLE SCHOOL ON GUAM

You may be entitled to an exemption from nonresident tuition if you attended both elementary AND middle school on Guam. You are not eligible for this exemption if you are a nonimmigrant alien.

ACTIVE MILITARY DUTY

United States Military personnel and their authorized dependents (as defined by the Armed Services) are exempted from the 12 month residency requirement during the period such personnel are stationed in Guam on active duty. NOTE: This exception does not apply to employees of other U.S. federal government departments, bureaus, or agencies or their dependents who are assigned or stationed to Guam.

LEGAL PLACE OF RESIDENCY

You may be entitled to an exemption from nonresident tuition if you are able to demonstrate to the Registrar that Guam is your legal place of residency and you intend to make Guam you permanent place of residency.

You may be entitled to an exemption from nonresident tuition if you are able to demonstrate that you permanently reside in Guam, but have been absent for only educational, training, or military reasons.

Non immigrant aliens, e.g. B,F,H,E Visa holders, are classified as non-residents and are not qualified for resident tuition rates or exemptions.

If you are classified as a non-resident and wish to be considered for resident reclassification. complete the "Petition for Residency Student Classification" before the semester or term you wish to enroll. Approved changes of status will become effective for the term or semester following the approval; they are not retroactive, and no refunds will be given.

SENIOR CITIZEN SUMMER POLICY

Because all summer classes are offered on a selfsustaining basis, there will be no Senior Citizen Tuition Waiver Program for these classes.

**You must officially withdraw from class(es) by the May 20, 2016, otherwise, you will receive a "UW" (unofficial withdrawal) for the class(es). Students who wish to withdraw from all courses after the "Schedule Adjustment" period must submit a Notification of Course Withdrawal form.

Students who are waiting for financial aid or have not yet paid for their tuition and fees are still financially obligated.

If you do not officially drop or withdraw from class(es) within the time periods scheduled and still owe tuition and fees; you are liable for payment and interest charges and will be billed accordingly. Therefore, it is crucial that you officially drop or withdraw from class(es) in a timely manner.

COURSES CANCELLED BY THE UNIVERSITY

Full refund will be mailed within four to six weeks. Tuition, fees, and the refund policy are subject to change as approved by the Board of Reaents.

ADMINISTRATIVE DROP

The Registrar may ADMINISTRATIVELY drop a student from any class for which she/he does not have the PREREQUISITE COURSES, or EXEMPTION from the prerequisites, whether the student enrolls in such a class during the registration or drop/add period. Students who are ADMINISTRATIVELY DROPPED after the REFUND PERIOD are not eligible for a REFUND of tuition or fees.

ADMISSION

DEFINITIONS (for tuition purposes):

Resident Student - Resident of Guam, Federated States of Micronesia (FSM), the Marshall Islands, Commonwealth of the Northern Marianas (CNMI), the Republic of Palau, and the United States who have met the Residency Requirements.

Non-Resident Student - Students who have not met the Residency Requirements. (See Residency Requirements)

UNDERGRADUATE - First-time students must complete an Application for Admission and must submit required documents by the deadline indicated in the Schedule of Application Deadline section. Official transcripts must be sent directly to the Admissions Office from the issuing institution(s). Applications may be submitted online at https://www.applyweb. com/apply/guam/ or mailed to the Admissions Office, UOG Station, Mangilao, Guam 96923. Failure to include the application fee will result in the denial of the application. Applications may be dropped at the Admissions Office, located in the Field House, 1st floor, NON-REFUNDABLE PROCESSING FEE (\$49 Resident & Non-Resident/\$74 International) must be paid at the Cashier's Office, located in the Administration Building, before submitting your application. (Cashier's office hours: 8:00 am - 4:00 pm)

New Freshmen - All entering Freshmen must take the English and Math Placement Examinations prior to registration. Students who place into EN085 or have not taken the English and Math Placement Tests are classified as "TRANSITION STUDENTS" and will be limited in their enrollment to certain approved courses for transition students.

Transfer Students - Students (applicants) are required to take the English and Math Placement examinations and may only be exempted if an official transcript has been submitted indicating the completion with a grade of "C" or better in the following:

- 1. three semester hours of college English for exemption from the English exam, and
- 2. three semester hours in intermediate algebra, college algebra, finite math or calculus for exemption from the math exam.


Students who place into EN085 have not taken the English and Math Placement Tests and have not fulfilled (1) and (2) are classified as "TRANSITION STUDENTS" and will be limited in their enrollment to certain approved courses for transition students.

Non-Degree - Applicants seeking specific courses for personal enrichment or professional advancement who do not require a degree program may apply as a Non-Degree Undergraduate. A Non-Degree student is not required to submit high school or previous college records or to take placement examinations unless the student is seeking to enroll in English and/or Math courses. (See Undergraduate Catalog - "Non-Degree Student" for more information and requirements).

GRADUATE - A graduate applicant seeking admission to a graduate program or to enroll in graduate courses must complete an Application for Admission at the Graduate Studies Office and provide supporting documents by the application deadline indicated in the Schedule of Application Deadlines. Official transcripts must be forwarded directly to the Graduate Studies Office from the issuing institution(s). Applications for admission to Graduate Studies Office are available at, and must be submitted to Graduate Studies, Research and Sponsored Programs, University of Guam, Health Science Building, 1st floor, Room 420. Applications without the appropriate fee will not be processed.

Former Students (Re-Entry) - Students who have not attended the University for one or more regular semesters (Fall or Spring) are required to submit an "Application for Re-Entry" at the Records Office or Graduate Studies, Research and Sponsored Programs, University of Guam, Health Science Building, 1st floor, Room 420 at least one week before registration. Official transcripts from all colleges and/or universities attended during the student's non-attendance at UOG are required and must be submitted directly to the Admissions & Records Office from the issuing institution(s) prior to registration. Proof of residency and standard enrollment requirements may be applied.

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


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






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
