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INTRODUCTION

The purpose of this report is to promote public awareness about the health related behaviors of our youth, and provide data information useful for program planning, policy advocacy, and community education. Funded by the Department of Education and the Department of Youth Affairs¹, it's intended audiences are professionals in education (teachers and administrators), mental and public health programs, the medical community, our island systems of public safety and juvenile justice, and anyone concerned with promoting and encouraging the well-being and advancement of youth, such as family service advocates, community and business leaders, non-profit organizations, legislators and others.

Guam's Youth Risk Behavior Surveys², are part of a U.S. National surveillance research system, which collects data on a range of health-risk behaviors to assess these factors that contribute to the major causes of mortality, morbidity and social problems on our island. Data measures are directed at substance use (including tobacco, alcohol, inhalants and steroids as well as the commonly defined illegal "hard" drugs), unintended accidents (e.g., wearing safety gear), victimization (e.g., date rape), sexuality, violence and disciplinary school problems (e.g., fighting or drug use at schools), as well as dietary, nutrition and physical activity behaviors.

Modified questionnaires³ were employed to collect YRBS data information from samples of both public and private high school students (Grade levels 9 to 12) and middle school students (Grade levels 6 to 8) on Guam during April of 2001. Procedures resulted in survey samples of 1,386 high school students, and 1,704 middle school students (see Methods section for more detail). Percentage distributions of each sample by grade, ethnicity, gender, and age are displayed in Table 1. The samples are representative of youth enrolled in Guam's schools.

METHODS

QUESTIONNAIRE CONTENT

For Guam's 2001 Youth Risk Behavior Survey (YRBS) study the University's Safe and Drug Free YRBS Project worked with the Departments of Education (DOE), and Youth Affairs (DYA), to organize an inter-agency advisory group of youth-related programs that utilize YRBS data (i.e., NGO's such as Sanctuary, Inc., and *Ina'fa Maoleg*, and public agency programs at Public Health, and Mental Health). The standard YRBS questionnaire was developed by the Division of Adolescent and School Health, National Center for Chronic Disease Prevention and Health Promotion, Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, working with a national network of representatives from state and local health and education agencies. By using the core, YRBS standard questionnaire Guam's data become comparable to U.S. national data. Even so, the advisory group developed "State Add-on" questions for Guam's high school and middle school questionnaires. These modified instruments were employed to collect YRBS data information from samples of both high school students (Grade levels 9 to 12) and middle school students (Grade levels 6 to 8) on Guam **during April of 2001.**

Chart 1 (page 6), located after Chart 3 (page 5), presents an item comparison of Guam's 2001 high and middle school questionnaires. The "ethnicity" item was modified to record the island's Pacific Islander and Asian communities, and a set of three Guam specific dietary/nutrition items were added to both questionnaires. Items on "sexual orientation," "gender of sex partners," and a "dental check-up" item were added only to the high school questionnaire. A "methamphetamine use" item was added to the middle school, same as the high school item. A Guam specific set of items were selectively added to either the high or middle school questionnaire to record participation in risk-prevention programs associated with the Drug Free Schools and Communities Program, Department of Youth Affairs.

SAMPLING

Guam's 2001 YRBS data collection was conducted at both Private and Public Schools.

The Archdiocese Catholic School System agreed to participate in Guam's 2001 YRBS. Among Guam's private schools, the Catholic School System has the largest non-public school enrollment, and draws from a population pool similar to that of the Public School System. The

Public and Catholic schools enroll about 95% of the island's total school age youth population. In the future we hope to include all island schools. Even so, we feel their exclusion this time does not limit the utility of results since these numerous, small schools draw from more unique sub-communities.

Guam's 2001 sampling frames, consisted of seven (7) high schools (public 4 and private 3), and thirteen (13) middle schools (public 7 and private 6). All agreed to participate and data were collected from all of these schools. Chart 2 displays the eligible student population counted as 2000-01 enrollments.

Given the eligible population size, and the sample size needed to achieve a ± 5 percent margin of error, class selection at each school was designed to collect about 1,400 completed questionnaires from high schools and the same for middle schools (anticipating response rates between 65% and 70% similar to previous years). A **Passive Parent Permission Procedure and Form** was used to obtain parental informed consent. A school representative (e.g., counselor, nurse, health faculty, or administrator) from each school (public and private) was trained and provided technical assistance. They selected a sampling of classes based upon average class size to obtain a sufficient number of students for collecting data at their school site. At several small

Catholic schools, individual student subjects were randomly selected from student enrollment listings, because students were only in one or two mixed grade-level classes.

Students marked their answers directly in the questionnaire booklets, which were then collected. The University of Guam's Community Resource Development Program provided facility space, computers, and organized staff to enter data into machine readable data files using the Statistical Package for the Social Sciences[®] software system. Data file CD-Rom, or a 3.5 diskette, can be provided upon request.

SAMPLE DEMOGRAPHICS

These procedures resulted in final survey sample sizes of 1,386 high school students, and 1,704 middle school students. Percentage distributions of each sample by grade, ethnicity, gender, and age are displayed in Chart 3. The samples appear very representative of Guam's school enrolled youth. Females are more likely to complete surveys, and less likely to be absent on any given school day. Absenteeism and drop-out rates tend to be higher for the final grade levels in high school.
