#### Engaging Faculty in Accreditation in a Changing Higher Education Environment *Tracy Poon Tambascia*

In a rapidly changing higher education environment, faculty engagement in university self-study and accreditation is more important than ever. This lecture will focus on the basics of accreditation, the value of faculty leadership and engagement in accreditation as part of the process of continual improvement, and key issues surfacing in postsecondary education that signal both opportunity and disruption.

#### INFORMATIVE SESSION

Student Success is Everyone's Business

This presentation will describe the student retention and completion rates at UOG and the national trends, goals, and initiatives related to improving student success. The recommendations from the Student Success Innovation Team will be presented, as well as the strategic framework for improving the student experience.

#### P&T Preparation Session Stephen Bednarzyk
