MINIMUM QUALIFICATION:

Bachelor's degree; or Associate's degree with three (3) years relevant and related work experience.

QUALIFICATIONS REQUIRED: Pursuant to Public Law 26-87 as amended by Public Law 29-113, all future employees of any position within the government of Guam will be required at minimum to possess one of the following:

1. A high school diploma; or
2. Successful completion of General Education Development (GED) Test; or
3. The equivalent of a general education high school program; or
4. Successful completion of a certification program, from a recognized accredited or certified vocational technical institution, in a specialized field for the job.

NECESSARY SPECIAL QUALIFICATIONS:

Must have a valid driver's license.

PREFERRED QUALIFICATIONS:

Bachelor's degree or higher in soil, agriculture, or biology; or currently enrolled in agronomy science, environmental science and/or have equivalent experience.

KNOWLEDGE, ABILITIES, AND/OR SKILLS:

Knowledge of soil, agricultural, biological, and environmental sciences. Ability to operate analysis computer programs such as Crop-Manager and develop skills in PixelWrench software to collect, summarize, and analyze data. Must have skills in scientific writing.

CHARACTER OF DUTIES:

Under the supervision of the project supervisor, the Research Associate I will measure crop roots and canopy cover as well as root water uptake and transport. The Research Associate I will perform field soil sampling and preparation (drying and weighing) for analysis to determine nutrient content, composition, and other characteristics (soil texture, pH levels). The Research Associate I will perform laboratory data testing for characterizing soil water retention, crop-rooting depth, and crop water coefficients. The Research Associate I will assemble and operate various field data collection apparatus such as tensiometer, irrigation miters, water marks, near-infrared camera, and microclimate weather stations. The Research Associate I will assist in planting and managing several crops at the UOG Research Station's study plots and the local farmer's fields located in the northern and southern areas of Guam as well as data collection.

EDUCATION:

Applicants claiming degrees or credit hours are required to have an original or certified copy of the documents (e.g., Transcripts, high school diploma or GED certification) accompany the application.

WORK ELIGIBILITY:

Submission of completed job applications authorizes the University of Guam to seek and obtain information regarding the applicant's suitability for employment. All factors which are job related may be investigated (e.g. previous employment, educational credentials, and criminal records). All information obtained may be used to determine the applicant's eligibility for employment in accordance with equal employment opportunity guidelines. In addition, the applicant releases previous employers and job related sources from legal liability for the information provided.

Section 25103, Chapter 25, Title 10 of the Guam Code Annotated requires college or university employees to undergo a physical examination, to include a test for tuberculosis (skin or x-ray), prior to employment and at least annually thereafter. A report of such examination must be conducted by a licensed physician within a state or territory of the United States and must be submitted upon request.

Federal law requires presentation of eligibility to work in the United States within seventy-two (72) hours of reporting for employment. Specifically, 8 USC 1324A requires the employer to verify the identity and eligibility to work in the United States of all newly hired employees. The University of Guam is required to comply with this law on a non-discriminatory basis. If you are hired to fill a position within the University of Guam, you will be required to present valid documents to comply with the law.

POLICE AND COURT CLEARANCE:

Pursuant to Public Law No. 28-24 and Executive Order No. 2005-34, applicants selected for a position are required to provide original police and court (Superior Court of Guam) clearances of no more than three (3) months old prior to commencement of employment. Off-island applicants must obtain clearances from their place of residence. Applicants are responsible for fees associated with obtaining the clearances.


