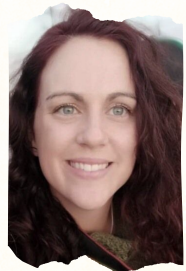

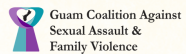

About the Speakers



Dr. Kevin Bales

Dr. Kevin Bales CMG is Research Director at the Right Lab at the University of Nottingham and professor of contemporary slavery. The Association of British Universities named his work one of "100 World-Changing Discoveries." In 2001 he co-founded the US NGO Free the Slaves, a group that has liberated thousands of slaves worldwide. His latest book, *Blood and Earth*, explores the deadly link between slavery and environmental destruction. Check out his TEDTalk.

Dr. Joseph Green

Dr. Joseph Green, Director of Applied Science at the Pacific Disaster Center, is an expert in the practical application of risk information for humanitarian assistance and resilience-building initiatives worldwide. His analytical work spans more than two decades, with specialized focus on the examination of the intersection between social vulnerability, health outcomes, and disaster resilience. Joseph earned his PhD in epidemiology from the State University of New York at Buffalo. Prior to earning his PhD, Joseph earned a Master's degree in medical geography from the University of South Florida and worked as a research fellow at the Centers for Disease Control (CDC). Dr. Green is a well-published author on the application of risk information to support disaster risk reduction and serves on the World Health Organization Global Outbreak and Alert Response Network.



Mr. Adam Gramann

Mr. Adam Gramann is the U.S. Indo-Pacific Command (USINDOPACOM) Liaison for the Pacific Disaster Center and works as an analyst on projects such as Advanced Analytics, Women, Peace, and Security, and Anti-Slavery. Mr. Gramann enlisted in the Navy in 2004 and deployed to Iraq in 2008 as a Combat Medicine Instructor working with Iraqi police as part of a Military Training Team. He was commissioned as a naval officer in 2012 and served in multiple assignments within USINDOPACOM focusing on security cooperation and interagency programs. Following his resignation from active service in 2019, Mr. Gramann affiliated with the Navy Reserves and worked with NavalX and So-Cal Tech Bridge- an innovation and agility cell, supporting and connecting tech initiatives across the Department of Defense. Mr. Gramann retired from the Navy Reserves in 2021. He holds a BA in Political Science from the University of Hawaii and an MS in Criminology from Chaminade University.

Captain Sarah Melville

Captain Sarah Melville is a U.S. Army officer. She began the initiative with Kevin, Joe, and Adam to build region-specific Countering Human Trafficking training for Special Operations Forces. She previously served in the U.S. Army Southern European Task Force, Africa and in the 173rd Infantry Brigade Combat Team (Airborne). Captain Melville holds a Master of Science in Refugees and Forced Migration Studies from the University of Oxford and a Bachelor of Science with a dual major in International Relations and Systems Management from the United States Military Academy at West Point.
