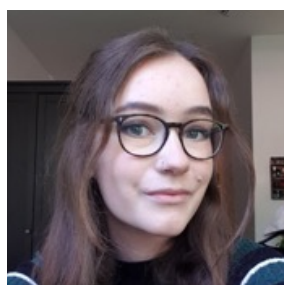
Rosa Salas Palomo is a CHamoru Language adjunct professor, and Sikritãria Kunitén Fino' CHamoru. She obtained her Master of Arts in Education in Reading in 1970 and attended three years at UCLA studying Applied Linguistics. She was appointed Director of Education and served for a year. Palomo was the first full-time teacher of CHamoru language at the University of Guam, where she developed courses for more advanced students.



Dr. Thomas Stolz is chair of general and comparative linguistics at the University of Bremen in Germany. His main fields of academic interest include language typology and language contacts. Since 1998, he has been actively involved in research on the CHamoru language. He has published 24 scholarly articles on CHamoru. Stolz has visited the Mariana islands various times to conduct field work.
