SUBJECT: MPA Graduate Program Degree Completion Plan

DEGREE REQUIREMENTS - From the Graduate Bulletin:

The Master of Public Administration program has three sequential stages: 1) Core Courses, 2) Elective Courses, and 3) Capstone experience. The capstone course shall only be taken in the student's graduating semester. All pre-service students must take PA598 as an elective.

This plan is in line with the standard that the average time it takes to complete a degree is 1.5 – 2 years. The degree completion is dependent upon the credit hour requirement of the program. Programs can vary from 30-60 credit hours. The average credit hours a program requires is 36 credit hours. G2G mandated for the graduate programs to standardize at 33 credit hours. For NASPAA accreditation purposes the MPA is maintained at 36 credit hours. Full-time status in graduate programs is 9 credit hours or 3 courses.
