

Empowering Tomorrow's Innovators: Strengthening STEM Education and Mentoring with Dr. Cheryl R. Sangueza, School of Education Faculty

Dr. Cheryl Sangueza, an Associate Professor and Chair of the M.Ed in Innovations in Teaching and Learning (InTaL) in the School of Education, also serves in several University of Guam STEM grant leadership positions. Her primary role is the lead for Participant Experiences and Mentoring for the Guam EPSCoR, NSF INCLUDES SEAS Islands Alliance, Navigating Home, and Sloan grants.

These grants activities build valuable cross-university connections, and partnerships with the community, region, and nation, especially with our sister Island Territories, the US Virgin Islands and Puerto Rico.

Two NSF INCLUDES summer programming that include Guam's education system and our neighboring island community college students just started! Students from our local high schools and from our neighboring islands join science lab teams (see chart below) to conduct an independent place-based STEM research study. Additional experiences include weekly mentoring seminars and an end of program presentation. Benefits include networking with a diversity of individuals, valuable research experiences, reflective discussions, a stipend, and an opportunity to complete at a national conference. For example, one high school student qualifies to compete at the International Science and Engineering Fair and our Bridge to Bachelor's students can avail of support to attend the National Diversity in STEM (NiDiSTEM) conference.





Each application requires 45–60 minutes of independent review prior to the Zoom meeting. You will have around four weeks to complete your comments and scores prior to the panel meeting.


