For each undergraduate course completed during the Fanuchånan 2021 semester, students will have the <u>option</u> of replacing the letter grade earned with an alternative grade that will not affect GPA calculations. The alternate grades available to undergraduates are as follows:

- Pass (P). All grades of C or better will be converted to a P, allowing the course to count as a prerequisite, any program requirement, or any other university requirement, and will allow progression to higher courses.
- **Credit (CR)**. Grades of D will be converted to a CR, allowing the course to count for certain general education courses or as pre-requisites in certain (but not many) majors.
- **No Credit (NC).** Grades of F will be converted to NC, which means the student must retake the course for credit, but the GPA will not be negatively impacted.

## **IMPORTANT NOTE:**

For courses in which students earn a P (Pass) or CR (Credit) grade, the credits will count toward total credits earned and completed courses for financial aid purposes. Students will be "held harmless" by the choice to select P/CR/NC in Fanuchånan 2021. Choosing the alternate grading option will not negatively impact their academic journey at UOG, nor will it be a barrier to entry into subsequent courses.
